



## HIDDEN GEMS



### 1. Course and Lesson Pre- and Post-Assessment

Reveal student learning gaps for targeted instruction with Inspire's assessments, which offer a variety of the most commonly used assessment item types from high-stakes tests from across the US. Deliver intensive intervention right away with short, premade lesson pre-assessments that build on prior knowledge and spotlight areas of need for accurate placement within courses. Post-assessments reinforce that students have closed a skill gap and allow teachers to make data-driven decisions.

### 2. Gradual Release of Responsibility Lesson Plan

Inspire provides a completely different experience for students—it is rigorous and differentiated, and students make progress. Lesson plans use an “I do, we do, you do” model and start with explicit, teacher-led instruction; move to guided practice; and finish with independent learning. Teachers are guided through this model with explicit lesson plans. Independent learning in Inspire strengthens students' problem-solving and promotes the generalization of skills.

### 3. New and Updated Warm-ups

Get students engaged in learning with Inspire's age- and grade-appropriate gamified warm-ups! Warm-ups activate prior knowledge to prepare students for active learning in the gradual release of responsibility model. Teachers receive insights into adjusting instruction for students with performance data that is collected automatically.

## 4. No Grade Bands—Access Any Course or Lesson Based on Student Need

Inspire is purchased as a student license rather than a grade-band pack, so all covered standards and content are included in the student license. Teachers can use the data to make decisions because they can access any course or lesson their students need, no matter the grade level. Since Inspire is aligned to general education standards, any student who needs intensive, targeted support to access those standards can do so, even if the standards' grade level is lower than the one in which the student is enrolled.

## 5. Course Offerings Continue to Grow

Math and reading courses were added first, with writing to come for Back to School 2024. As courses are added to Inspire, teachers will have new ways to meet student needs using a more robust math, reading, and writing library that spans elementary and middle school, addressing the most critical skills.
