

A program helps people prepare for weather. This program is Weather-Ready Nation.














Weather-Ready Nation has a website. The website has information about weather.

The National Weather Service is a government group.






Many meteorologists work for the National Weather Service. Meteorologists are scientists. They study weather.



Meteorologists work with communities near the offices. They teach people how to be safe.








The meteorologists look for dangerous weather.








Dangerous weather can be anywhere!

Temperatures can be dangerous too. Very hot or very cold temperatures can hurt people.








People should know when dangerous weather is coming.

A warning means go quickly to a safe place. Dangerous weather is coming!








Any place can have dangerous weather. Being prepared can help people be safe.


METEOROLOGIST

The National Weather Service headquarters is in Maryland.








1. Put cereal and water into bowl. Stir.
